Brain Development

Play is necessary for healthy brain development and learning.

Interaction

Through play, children learn how to respond to their environment, allows them to explore, create, and learn about their world. It helps them improve the way they cope with fear and roles of adults, babysitters, teachers, etc.

Builds Confidence

Play gives them capabilities that build confidence and the ability to overcome challenges.

Negotiation & Conflict
