## Items Powered by Lithium Batteries



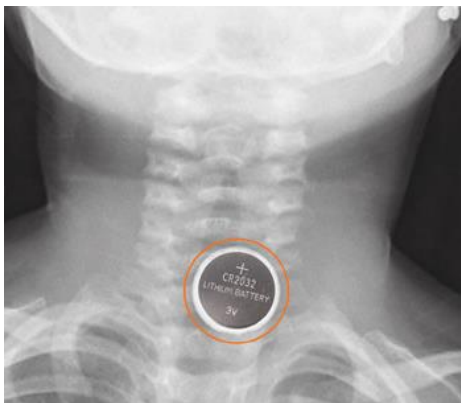
Coin-sized lithium batteries are used in:

- Children's talking books

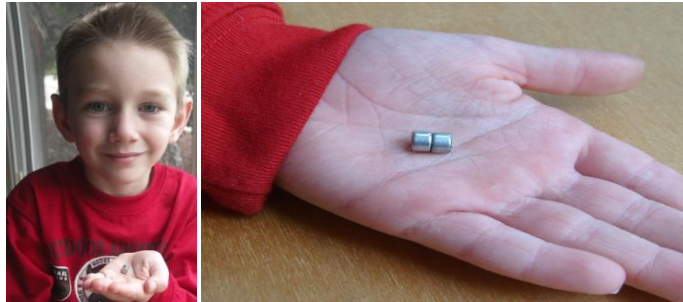


Infants and toddlers like to put things in their mouths and tear things. With these items the lithium battery can fall out and children have put these into their mouths and when swallowed:

- Get stuck in throat
- The saliva activates the battery
- Burning inside their throat



## Small Magnets



Powerful small novelty magnets, designed for adults are attractive to older children and teens. Teens have used these for temporary tongue & lip rings and small children for play, but when accidentally swallowed is dangerous to anyone:

- The magnets digest and are so strong they connect in the intestines causing the intestine to tear and bleed, requiring serious and many surgeries if not risk of death.
