Tips for Parent's at Report Card Time



If there is a problem at school:

- SIT DOWN with your child and look over the report card
- PRAISE YOUR CHILD. Find at least one good thing (such as attendance-no tardiness, etc.)
- BE CALM! Let your child tell you about his/her grades
- ASK how you can help your child to do better
- ASK what your child can do to make better grades
- MAKE A PLAN with your child's teacher and your child to do better

If you have questions or need help with your child's school performance, contact your child's teacher, guidance counselor, or principal.



You want your child to succeed, so remember grades are an opportunity for learning. Of course an "A" is great, but not always possible. There can be many reasons for a child to not be able to obtain a higher grade.

When they get a lower grade listen to your child and go from there.

If you want them to succeed, nurture and encourage, model positive behaviors will be more beneficial with a lower grade than yelling or discipline. Dr. Safety
